Nebraska FCCLA along with their Circle of Friends, come together to create a partnership for the strong future of Nebraska FCCLA and its members. These partnerships help fund the State Leadership Conference including STAR Event awards, FCCLA Serves transportation and meals for participants, and the Awards and Recognition dinner. Through these sponsorships, Nebraska FCCLA allows members to keep doing the things they love through STAR Events and continue to expand opportunities at State Leadership Conference and throughout the year.

Without these sponsors the State Leadership Conference and other state events wouldn't be as great as they are today.

So what can you do to help grow the Circle of Friends? Consider encouraging family members, local businesses, and even your chapter to invest into the future of Nebraska FCCLA. There are varying levels of contribution with each of these levels having different dollar amounts and benefits. It could be a \$50 sponsorship of a STAR Event or a \$200 donation that would purchase

20 lunches for FCCLA Serves participants. Gathering these donations for Nebraska FCCLA could also make a big difference in your local chapter's funds through the Chapter Developer Award. This award distributes up to \$600 back to chapters that raise funds from their community to give to Nebraska FCCLA. This year, the top prize of \$300 went to Howells-Dodge, \$200 went to David City, and \$100 went to Wakefield. These funds are applied to their State Leadership Conference making their costs drop drastically.

The financial backbone of Nebraska FCCLA is the responsibility of all of its members. Please make a personal or chapter goal in promoting FCCLA in your community, and helping us grow in the years to come.

There are several awards available for chapters and individuals about membership. One of these awards is a the Red and White Chapter Affiliation Award. These are designed to encourage FCCLA members and advisers to recruit FCCLA members from their Family and Consumer courses. Family and Consumer Sciences teachers are one of first to recruit new FCCLA members. We would like to take the chance to recognize their efforts to recruit members from their own classrooms. This award is based on the percentage of students enrolled in Family and Consumer Sciences courses compared to the number of members in the FCCLA chapter.

Another membership award in Nebraska is through the membership campaign, BFF, or Best FCCLA Friend. Through BFF, if you recruit a new member, you can be recognized at

the State Leadership Conference. The more members you recruit, the more times you can enter! One lucky member who completes the application will receive an FCCLA prize pack on stage during the Business and Recognition Session.

How do I get recognition for Power of One?

Members can receive recognition at the State and National level after completion of all five units of Power of One. To receive this recognition there are a few steps that must be completed.

First of all, you need to complete the form that is posted on the Nebraska FCCLA website under Programs or at http://www.nebraskafccla.org/programs/. Complete the Power of One recognition application and have your adviser submit this electronically to the State Adviser.

After this is completed, your Adviser needs to select your name as a candidate for recognition in the affiliation system. This should only be done once all individuals are entered.


All steps must be completed by March 1.
