During the 2017-2018 school year FCCLA is using the theme “Inspired by FCCLA” to inspire students to explore career opportunities, develop leadership skills, and grow personally while making a difference in their family and community.



STAR Events (*Students Taking Action with Recognition*) is a program of Family, Career and Community Leaders of America (FCCLA) that builds student’s leadership and career-related skills at the local, regional, state, and national levels.

Participants from Nebraska said:

635 students completed **393** projects, reaching approximately **268,599** people

Why did we compete in STAR Events?

Participants from Nebraska joined nearly 22,000 students from across the country in STAR Events. Students reported participating to increase leadership skills, to apply college and career-readiness skills to future goals, to meet personal, school, or community needs, and to learn and have fun!

How useful are STAR Events for my future?

Nebraska students reported, along with 90% of all national participants, that these events are very or extremely useful as they prepare for future experiences.
