

"The FCCLA Financial Fitness national peer education program involves youth teaching one another how to make, save, and spend money wisely. Through FCCLA's Financial Fitness program, youth plan and carry out projects that help them and their peers learn to become wise financial managers and smart consumers." -National FCCLA

Financial Fitness has 4 units to help students and members create a plan to save money smartly. The first unit is earning which is sharpening on the job Financial Fitness, the second one is Spending where you track and plan personal spending, the third unit is Saving where members conquer bank accounts, credit, and investing, and the last unit is protecting where members keep financial and personal interests safe. These units are the perfect way for members to learn how to save money and spend it properly.

There are ways to earn recognition for doing a project about financial fitness. If you submitted your project to the State by March 1st you could earn recognition at the state level. If you also submitted your project to Nationals by March 1st your chapter can earn money. The Runner up gets \$500 for their chapter, the middle school winner gets \$1000 for their chapter, and the high school winner gets \$1000 for their chapter.
