

- Complete all 4 aspects of the selection process
 - Application
 - Written Test
 - Presentation
 - Interview
- Application
 - Found on the Nebraska FCCLA website
 - Complete the application fully and send to state advisor by the deadline
- Written Test
 - Test conducted at SLC
 - Use Study Guide (found on Nebraska FCCLA website) to prepare
- Presentation
 - Get assigned a topic at Peer Education Conference in February
 - Prepare a 2-3 presentation with visuals
- Interview
 - Will go through a short interview at SLC after your presentation
