### Make a Safe Driving Video

Get a few of your friends, or your whole chapter to make a video that relates to FACTS, make it fun and creative while also teaching and showing your community and peers how to drive safely!

### Contact the State Patrol To Speak

Get in touch with the state patrol or even your local police department to have a presentation at your school. The EMT is also a good resource to have speaking in front of the school.

#### Crash Simulator

A crash simulator is a great way to bring awareness to safe driving. A resource you can use to get a crash simulator is your local or state police departments.
